# **Hub News - Jodie Matthews , Strategic Lead**



What's the catch? It's the question I probably get asked the most in my role as Strategic Lead of Roade English Hub. As leaders and educators we know that very rarely does anything come for free and the Hub offer of free support and funding sounds to good to be true! I think it's what puts a lot of schools off from applying.

However, on this occasion I honestly believe that there is no catch. Hubs hold funding from the DFE to give to schools to help them with decodable books, phonics training, subscriptions to their phonics scheme and phonics and early reading resources. We actually have spend targets and are expected to give out a large amount of money each year. So if you know schools that haven't applied yet, please encourage them to do so. Schools can receive up to £6000! All they have to do is fill out a self referral form on our website and then one of our team will arrange to visit to discuss action planning and help them plan how to spend the money. It's a quick process and many school are able to spend their funding just a few weeks after applying.

We only have funding for about another 20 schools this academic year, so if you know of any schools who may benefit from our support and funding towards phonics, reading and early language, please encourage them to fill out a self-referral form and we can get their audit booked in. 
### **Talk Through Stories**

Preparing For The PSC

I'm Sally Currell and I've been a Literacy Specialist for 6 years working at Roade English Hub. Being the English/Reading/ know, a big part of this job is to ensure that children learn to read. Our aim

is to teach them to read words so that they can gain meaning and currently this since the PSC began I have prepared the teachers and children for it and here are

- 1. Analyse assessments Which sounds are common errors?
- -Is it real or alien words that have the most errors?
- -Which children are not on track to pass? 2.Practice, practice – 'Make the most of every moment!'

Keep sound cards, real and alien word cards with those tricky sounds on, on you at all times. Flash sounds and cards at moments throughout the day e.g. when lining up for break or lunch, getting ready to go home.

- 3.Add in additional afternoon practice sessions,10 mins a day, and use these to teach to the gaps
- 4.Daily 1:1 interventions for those not on track to pass

5.Ensure you have checked and read the administration guidance and know what support can be given to pupils with SEN as long as it is part of normal classroom practice

6.Carry out regular PSC practices so you know who is on track to pass and can address common errors. Scores out of 40 that show children are on track to pass: Nov – 19, Feb – 25, April – 35. THis will also make the children familiar with the test

7. Challenge children to improve the number of sounds and words each week. 8.Make it fun!







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
